Day Treatment Program

Educational alternative setting designed to meet the needs of children between 10-18 who are experiencing emotional and behavioral difficulties and or have not found success with traditional educational or therapeutic interventions. Program services include: full school and group programming, individual and/or family therapy, psychiatric consultation/ medication management, and transportation.

Respite Care

Remington House provides respite care to youth in need between the ages of 10-18 due to safety concerns in the home. Services include: room and board, daily programming including school, recreation, and groups, and case management services to assist with safety planning and return back home.

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About Us....

The Jacob Center is a private non-profit youth and family service agency founded in 1988 by three social workers. Jacob, a family name, is historically associated with healing and also refers to an ancient surveying instrument, (A Jacob staff) whereby people could get their bearings.

The Jacob Center maintains two offices in Fort Collins, however serves youth and families throughout Northern Colorado. Professionals and community residents compromise the board and staff.

The Jacob Center **Programs and Services** *d.b.a Jacob Family Services*

Coaching Service

Home-based services for children, parents, and families in Larimer County. Focuses on providing intensive support services to youth and families both in and out of home. Coaches work to provide clients with strategies to improve current level of functioning and decrease negative behavior as well as one-on-one mentoring and skill development for parents and children in order to avoid placement disruptions. This service focuses on community connection/ engagement in prosocial activities.

Community Based Visitation

Provides highly trained staff to supervise visits between children placed in out of home care and their parents or family. Focus on development of parenting skills and consistent/frequent visitation in an effort to reduce length of foster care placement.

The Jacob Center **Programs and Services (cont')** *d.b.a Jacob Family Services*

Individual and Family Therapy

Four therapists specialize in approaches including, but not limited to: Play Therapy, Sand Tray and EMDR (Eye Movement Desensitization & Reprocessing).

NYPUM Program

The National Youth Program Using Minibikes Program is an Experiential Therapy program for children and youth ages 10-16 that teaches how to safely ride minibikes. After the youth learn to ride the motorcycle, they are expected to earn riding time by achieving three goals each week. Email referrals to Meghan@jacobcenter.org

Specialized Foster Care Coaching

Provides home-based support staff to Larimer DHS Specialized Foster Parents, providing consistent, long-term, and intensive support services .

Trauma Assessments

Provides comprehensive clinical assessments and recommendations for youth and families identified by Larimer DHS.

Trauma Treatment Coordinator

Highly trained staff provide trauma informed skill integration, education and coordination of trauma informed services.

Residential Child Care Facility Program (RCCF)

The Remington House is a 20 bed residential facility that serves adolescents ages 10-18. It is a 24-hour staff secure setting and services a range of behavioral and emotional issues including all types of abuse, family relational issues, trauma and adjustment issues, thought disorders, delinquency issues, suicidal behaviors, attachment and substance abuse. The youth work through a level system that encourages self-awareness and self-discovery. Clients are assigned a primary therapist that meets with them a minimum of once a week as well as provides family therapy and crisis intervention. The youth attend therapeutic groups on a daily basis that include substance use, psychotherapeutic issues, social skills, teambuilding, art therapy, creative expressions and conflict resolution. The average length of placement is four months.

Acute Treatment Unit (ATU)

Short-term residential option developed to meet the needs of youth who are struggling with significant mental health and family issues. Clients with acute needs are provided with intensive therapeutic care for a period of 1-2 weeks until they can be successfully transitioned into the community with appropriate supports.

Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP)

The IOP program was developed to meet the needs of youth who benefit from increased supervision, structured peer interactions, and continued therapeutic support in order to maintain placement within the community. IOP clients spend scheduled time at Remington House in a staff-secure setting.
